Some items can even be dropped-off for free at the Shoreway Environmental Center. See other side for location, hours of operation and accepted items.

Here's a quick guide on what to do with some unwanted items you may find during your move.

Household Goods Donation

If you have items you want to get rid of that still may be of use to someone else, such as mattresses and furniture, please consider alternatives to throwing them in the garbage by donating or repurposing them.

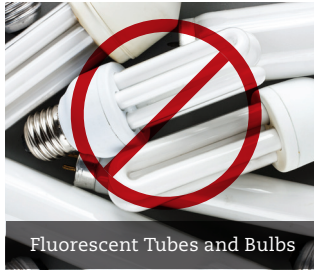

By law, these items DO NOT go into the trash, recycling, or compost bins.

To dispose of a variety of HHW, you may schedule an appointment with San Mateo County's Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Program at smchealth.org/hhw or call (650) 363-4718.

Batteries/Cell Phones – These items are illegal to throw away in the garbage or recycling. If your complex is participating in Recology's Battery & Cell Phone Collection Program, you can discard used and unwanted batteries/cell phones in the orange bucket. The following items are accepted free of charge:

- Household Batteries
- Cell phones
- Cooking oil (up to 15 gallons)
- Electronics
- Film plastic
- Fluorescent lights
- Paint (latex and oil-based)
- Used motor oil (up to 15 gallons) and filters
- Antifreeze
- Sharps/Needles (must be in sealed container)
- Mattresses
- Medicine (Non-Controlled Substances Only)



The Shoreway Environmental Center is owned by RethinkWaste and operated by South Bay Recycling. The facility is open to the public and provides a local and convenient option for public disposal and recycling.
