

PROGRESS UPDATE

- Levee improvements construction is well-underway from Port Royal Avenue to the San Mateo Bridge!
 For public safety, that portion of Levee Trail is closed while construction is taking place. The pathway on Seal Slough is an alternative for people to enjoy while the Levee Trail is closed.
- Most of the existing trail has been torn up, and sheet piles have been installed up to Shorebird Park. Ongoing work includes clearing the trail surface, compacting, grading, base installation, excavation, and more.
- The anticipated schedule of Levee Trail closures is as follows. Please note that all schedules are subject to change due to weather, unforeseen circumstances, or other factors:
 - Phase 1: Southern project limit to Shorebird Park October 2020 January 2023
 - Phase 2: Shorebird Park to San Mateo Bridge January 2021 December 2022
 - Phase 3: San Mateo Bridge to northern project limit May 2021 January 2023
- Beach Park Blvd. has been reconfigured from approximately Foster City Blvd. to Teal St. to provide for a 'construction staging' lane on the east side of the street next to the levee. The speed limit has been reduced to 25 mph.
- For public safety, the temporary bicycle/runner lane ('COVID lane') on Beach Park Blvd./E. Hillsdale Blvd. from Foster City Blvd. to Rainbow Bridge is closed.
