## WHAT IS ZERO WASTE

### THE PROBLEM

Landfills are a significant source of the potent greenhouse gas methane, created when organic materials like food waste decompose without oxygen. Organics, recyclables and many other materials are resource-intensive to manufacture and limited in supply. They should instead be reused and recycled to sustain economies and healthy communities for the long term.

### DEFINITION OF ZERO WASTE

Zero waste is a philosophy that promotes reuse, recycling, composting and conservation programs, and emphasizes sustainability by considering the entire life-cycle of products and systems.

Many common household products that we use in our daily lives contain potentially hazardous materials and require special care when disposed of. It is illegal to dispose of hazardous waste in the garbage, down storm drains, or onto the ground. Chemicals in illegally or improperly disposed hazardous waste can be released into the environment and contaminate our air, water, and even the food we eat. To keep your home healthy, Sonoma County offers several programs for the free and convenient disposal of Household Hazardous Waste (HHW), like motor oil, paint, batteries, pesticides & fertilizer, fluorescent bulbs, fire extinguishers, expired medications, and more.

CA state law SB 1383 is now in effect, as of January 1, 2022. As part of SB 1383, large food generators are required to donate any excess edible food to feed hungry people. With rising food costs, food insecurity and inequity is a growing problem. By strengthening our food systems to connect people in need with excess food, Sonoma County can bolster the health of our communities.

Jurisdictions in Sonoma County have implemented a model ordinance to ban the sale of polystyrene foam foodware and foodware containing per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS). PFAS are synthetic chemicals commonly used in disposable food service ware to repel water and grease. Also known as "forever chemicals," PFAS pose a public health risk as they accumulate in our waterways, and are very difficult to break down. To decrease contamination in our creeks and rivers, switch to reusable food and beverage containers, bags, utensils and straws.

When organic materials such as leaves, twigs, grass clippings, and food scraps break down aerobically (with oxygen), they turn into compost. Farmers and gardeners often refer to compost as "black gold" because it is a nutrient-rich soil amendment that can help plant growth.

Compost boosts drought resiliency while also providing carbon, nitrogen, phosphorus, and beneficial bacteria to the soil microbiome. Healthy, biodiverse soils reduce the need for chemical fertilizers and pesticides.

## HEALTHY COMMUNITIES

To help keep our communities clean and healthy, we all need to pitch in. You can contribute by joining Zero Waste Task Force (ZWTF) biannual trash cleanup events, or volunteering to pick up litter on some of our busiest roads with Sonoma County's Adopt-A-Road program.

**TRANSPORTING AND PACKING YOUR MATERIAL:** State transportation laws limit each vehicle to a maximum of 15 gallons of liquid (with a maximum of 5 gallons per container) or 125 pounds of solid material. Liquid limits are measured by the outer size of the container, not the contents. • Never mix chemicals.

• Place in sealed containers in the trunk, packed to prevent spills. • Sharps must be in a sealed and labeled approved container.

• Radioactive materials • Biological waste (sharps/needles okay) • Controlled substances • Compressed gas cylinders (propane cylinders 20 pounds or under okay)

### HHW ROVER PICKUP SERVICE

Each Wednesday, the HHW Rover serves a different region of Sonoma County. Home pickup services are provided on a first-come-first-served basis. Allow several weeks' advance notice.

**FEE:** \$50/pickup (limit 440 pounds or 54 gallons). Free pickup available for seniors over 80 years of age and housebound residents.

When you call or email, please describe the types and amounts of the household hazardous waste you want picked up. You will be required to submit a written pickup request by email, fax or mail.

**HOURS:** Wednesdays, limited appointments available.



## TWO SERVICE OPTIONS FOR BUSINESSES

Services are available for businesses that qualify as Very Small Quantity Generators as per regulations (CCR Title 22 §66260.10), which are businesses that generate 100 kilograms (27 gallons liquid or 220 pounds solid) or less of hazardous waste per month.



### WHAT IS THE PROCESS?

1. Download Business Hazardous Waste Disposal Forms from [zerowastesonoma.gov](http://zerowastesonoma.gov)
2. Obtain a Hazardous Waste EPA ID number (if needed).
3. Submit paperwork by fax or email to receive an appointment and pricing information.

### WILL THIS PROGRAM MEET THE DISPOSAL REQUIREMENTS OF REGULATING AGENCIES?

You will receive a receipt of disposal for your records that will satisfy regulatory disposal requirements. Receipts and all records should be kept for a minimum of three years.

### DOES USING THIS PROGRAM MEAN MY BUSINESS WILL BE INSPECTED FOR HAZARDOUS WASTE?

Zero Waste Sonoma is not a regulatory agency.

**COMMON EXAMPLES OF HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE** Household hazardous wastes are any unwanted products commonly labeled as toxic, poison, combustible, corrosive, flammable, or irritant, etc.

**YARD:** Fertilizers • Fungicides • Insecticides • Pesticides • Pool chemicals • Propane cylinders, 5 gallons and smaller • Rodenticides • Weed killers

**HOUSE:** Aerosol sprays • Asbestos • Batteries • Cleaners • Cosmetics • Fire extinguishers • Fluorescent lamps • LED lights • Medications • Nail polish and remover • Sharps/needles • Toiletries

**GARAGE:** Antifreeze • Auto batteries • Automatic transmission fluid • Brake fluid • Engine cleaners • Road flares • Fuel such as butane, diesel, gasoline, kerosene and lamp oil • Motor oil and filters • Power-steering fluid

**WORKSHOP:** Flammable liquids and solids • Glues • Paint • Paint thinners • Photo chemicals • Solvents • Wood finishes

Bulky item pickup means that certain items such as mattresses, appliances, furniture, excess yard debris/organics (bagged or bundled), and electronics\* that cannot fit into the garbage or yard debris cart or that need special handling will be picked up by appointment. 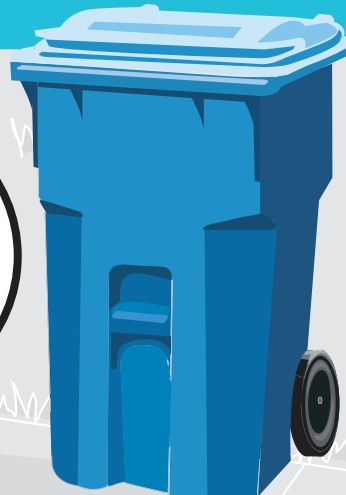

## HOW CLEAN DO YOUR RECYCLABLES NEED TO BE?

Recycling standards are getting stricter. The market is requiring high-quality materials. Bottles and containers need to be empty of food and liquid. Paper needs to be clean and dry. Follow the steps below:

### POUR OUT LIQUIDS

### SCRAPE OUT FOOD FROM RECYCLABLES

### WIPE OUT OILY OR STICKY RESIDUE FROM RECYCLABLES

### GREASY, GRIMY, GOOEY, WET, OR FOOD-SOILED PAPER GOES IN YOUR COMPOST CART

## WINDSOR ONLY



In Windsor, your recyclable materials must be separated. Put metal, glass, and plastic containers on the blue side and put cardboard and paper on the yellow side. Place shredded paper in a paper bag inside the yellow side.

## TIP: KEEP CAPS ON



It is preferable to leave screw-top lids on empty plastic, glass, and metal containers. If lids are removed from the container, they are too small to be recycled.

## PREVENT FOOD LOSS AND SAVE MONEY

**CHECK YOUR SUPPLIES BEFORE SHOPPING** Use up the food you have.

**STICK TO A GROCERY LIST** to avoid impulsive buying. Don't shop when you're hungry.

**PROACTIVELY FREEZE** bread, vegetables, dairy, and meat before they go bad if you buy in bulk and don't go through the food fast enough.



**BUY A VARIETY OF FOOD** Some foods last longer than others. Eat leafy greens and mushrooms first, but keep root vegetables and squash in the pantry to eat later.

**PURCHASE FOOD THAT IS IN SEASON** for the greatest value, least embedded food miles, and longevity of shelf life. Further, consider purchasing from local farmers and markets first when planning your shopping; that ensures seasonality, freshness, minimal packaging, and maximum impact on the local economy.

### THE PROBLEM WITH BIODEGRADABLE AND COMPOSTABLE PLASTIC PRODUCTS

Plates, bowls, cups, utensils, bags, or other food service ware labeled **biodegradable** or **compostable** cannot be composted in the backyard or placed in curbside carts. Backyard compost piles don't have high enough temperatures to break them down. Industrial composting facilities cannot easily distinguish these products from conventional plastic products, so they are screened out and sent to the landfill. Please choose reusable items whenever possible and place compostable plastic products in the garbage bin.

The recycling industry is controlled by economics of supply and demand. When you buy goods made with recycled content, your purchases help create a demand for materials collected in recycling programs.

Remember to ask stores you frequent which products they carry are made with post-consumer content. This means the product was made from materials that were used and recycled by consumers, rather than from virgin material.

ARE YOU A DO-IT-YOURSELFER? RECYCLE YOUR MOTOR OIL AND FILTER TOO!

## HOW TO USE OIL COLLECTION SITES



**DID YOU KNOW THAT USED MOTOR OIL NEVER WEARS OUT? IT JUST GETS DIRTY AND CAN BE RECYCLED, CLEANED, AND USED AGAIN.** Place your motor oil in a drain pan or sealed see-through reusable container you take back with you. Some sites offer a 40¢ per gallon rebate for used motor oil.

**VISIT SITES DURING BUSINESS HOURS. ABANDONING OIL OR ANY OTHER SUBSTANCE IN ANY QUANTITY AFTER HOURS IS NOT RECYCLING! IT IS ILLEGAL, PUNISHABLE BY IMPRISONMENT OR A FINE UP TO \$10,000.**

- Sites typically accept no more than 5 gallons of used motor oil and 2 filters at one time.
- One or 2 oil filters are usually accepted for free; some locations charge up to \$3.
- Antifreeze fees range from no cost to \$3/gallon.

### ABOUT CONTAMINATED OIL

Sites will not accept used motor oil that has been contaminated with other fluids such as antifreeze, solvents, gasoline, or water. Even a small amount of contamination causes the entire tank of motor oil collected to become non-recyclable. # POLICY

## AB 827 COMMERCIAL ORGANICS AND RECYCLING BINS

CUSTOMER ACCESS TO RECYCLING: REQUIRES BUSINESSES TO MAKE COMPOSTING AND RECYCLING BINS ACCESSIBLE TO CUSTOMERS AT RESTAURANTS, MALLS, AND OTHER BUSINESSES.



Commercial businesses that serve food for immediate consumption must provide customers access to organic collection bins on the premises. Organics bins must be in addition and adjacent to recycling and trash. Bins must be correctly and clearly marked with educational signage indicating what can and cannot go into each bin. Full service restaurants are exempt as long as the bins are provided to employees.

## SB 1383 SHORT-LIVED CLIMATE POLLUTANTS

APPLIES TO ALL COMMERCIAL ENTITIES, INCLUDING FOR-PROFIT AND NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS, PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SCHOOLS, GOVERNMENT BUILDINGS, AND MULTIFAMILY RESIDENTIAL DWELLINGS.

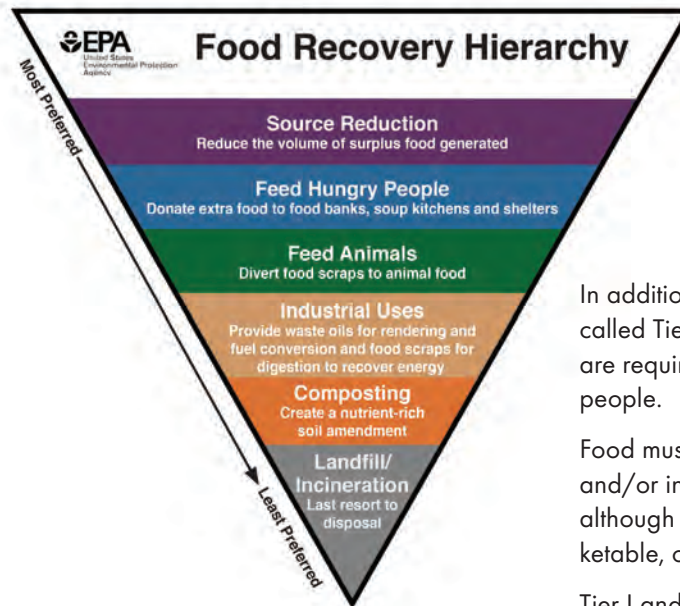
In effect since Jan 1, 2022, Senate Bill 1383 is a comprehensive state law aimed at reducing greenhouse gas emissions to slow climate change.

**THE STATE DEFINES ORGANICS AS FOOD, GREEN MATERIALS, LANDSCAPE/ PRUNINGS, NON-HAZARDOUS WOOD SCRAP, AND FOOD-SOILED PAPER**

### HOW TO COMPLY

- All residents and commercial entities are required to subscribe to curbside organics collection (green bin) service in addition to recycling and garbage.
- All residents and commercial entities must separate food scraps, plant trimmings, food-soiled paper and other organic materials from the garbage and place them into the green bin to be sent for composting.
- Commercial entities include for profit and nonprofit organizations, public and private schools, government buildings, and multifamily residential dwellings.

## FEED PEOPLE, NOT LANDFILLS!

In addition, large food producing entities, called Tier I and Tier II Entities under the law, are required to recover excess food to feed people.

Food must be safe to eat, whole, unserved, and/or in unopened and original packaging although they might be blemished, less marketable, or slightly stale.

# BUSINESS LAWS & ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

## DISPOSABLE FOOD SERVICE WARE AND POLYSTYRENE FOAM BAN MODEL ORDINANCE

APPLIES TO FOOD/BEVERAGE PROVIDERS, RETAILERS, SPECIAL EVENT PROMOTERS, GOVERNMENT ENTITIES, CONTRACTORS, AND LESSEES.

Jurisdictions in Sonoma County have implemented a model ordinance to ban the sale of certain polystyrene foam products and limit the use of non-recyclable or non-compostable disposable food ware. Please confirm specific requirements within your jurisdiction.

### ABOUT THE MODEL ORDINANCE

- Prohibits polystyrene foam food ware and foodware containing per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) distributed by food and beverage providers.
- Prohibits polystyrene foam food ware and specified polystyrene foam products sold by retail stores.
- Requires food/beverage providers and special events to use compostable or recyclable single-use food service ware and accessories.
- Requires food/beverage providers to provide single-use straws, lids, cutlery, and to-go condiment packages only upon request.
- Encourages use of reusables.

## ORDINANCE NO. 2014-2 WASTE REDUCTION PROGRAM FOR CARRYOUT BAGS ORDINANCE

APPLIES TO ALL GROCERY STORES AND RETAIL ESTABLISHMENTS.



- Prohibits all single-use plastic carryout bags (point-of-sale or checkout).
- Requires a minimum 10¢ charge on all compliant recycled paper bags.
- Charge must be displayed separately on customer receipt.
- Stores to keep the charge.

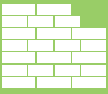

## FLUORESCENT LAMPS NEED SPECIAL DISPOSAL



Fluorescent lamps contain mercury vapor. Although the amount of mercury vapor in each lamp is small, care should still be taken in handling and disposing of fluorescent lamps.

### WHAT IF A LAMP BREAKS?

- Open a window and leave the room for 15 minutes or more.
- Turn off central heat/air conditioning.
- Do not vacuum. Instead, collect the pieces using a stiff piece of paper, such as an index card.
- Pat the area with the sticky side of packing tape to remove glass shards.
- Put all material into a sealed container.

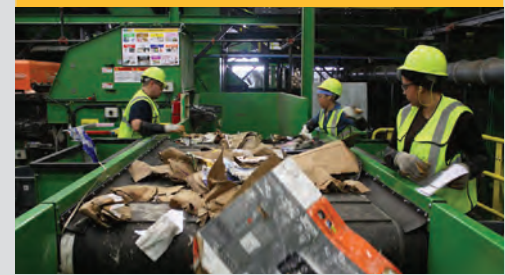

### WHAT'S THE PROBLEM

#### DANGER TO WORKERS



California State Law makes it illegal to dispose of home-generated sharps in the garbage or recycling bin.

This includes hypodermic needles, pen needles, intravenous needles, lancets, and other devices that are used to penetrate the skin for delivery of medications used in the care of people and animals.

When placed in the garbage or recycling bin, sharps can injure sanitation workers.

#### HOW TO PREPARE

- For drop-off, sharps must be in FDA-approved sharps containers.
- The only legal way to transport used sharps is in an FDA-approved sharps container.
- The container must be labeled **Sharps Waste** and **Biohazard**.
- Sharps waste will not be accepted in paper bags, plastic bags, or non-approved containers.
- Household Hazardous Waste programs will not accept sharps that contain controlled substances.
