RECYCLE

Put clean and dry recyclable items loose in the blue cart EXCEPT for shredded paper—place that in a paper bag labeled "shredded paper." **NO PLASTIC BAGS**

IT'S THE LAW! State Law 1383 requires proper sorting between all three waste streams.

USED MOTOR OIL & FILTERS

can be placed in a clear screw top container and clear zip-top bag **NEXT TO THE BLUE CART**. You may request a container and bag from Recology. COMPOST

Put food scraps, food & beverage soiled paper, and yard/landscape materials in the green cart. **No glass and plastics (including Bioplastics).**

Kitchen Pail

Residents are provided small kitchen pails at no charge, to make it more convenient to collect compostable materials at home. Simply use the pail for food scraps and food/ beverage soiled paper, then empty the contents into your green cart.

HOLIDAY TREES

may be placed **NEXT TO YOUR GREEN CART** from Jan. 2 to Jan. 31. Trees longer than 8 ft. in length will need to be cut up and placed next to your green cart.

LANDFILL

Put non-recyclable, non-organic, and non-toxic items in the black cart.

OTHER SERVICE INFORMATION

MANDATORY ORGANICS RECYCLING

Senate Bill 1383 (SB 1383) is a law enacted by the State of California to reduce harmful greenhouse gas emissions to combat climate change. **As of January 1, 2022, compost service is required by state law.** Jurisdictions have the authority to assess a fine for noncompliance.

All food scraps, food/beverage soiled paper products, and yard trimmings are to be placed in the green Compost Cart as noted on the previous page. This ensures none of those materials are going to the landfill, which is where they would decompose and produce methane—one of the most potent greenhouse gases in Earth's atmosphere. Due to compliance with CA law, your carts may be inspected randomly by a RethinkWaste contractor for proper sorting in the future. All single-family households are automatically provided compost service and may request a free kitchen pail. If your household does not have compost service, please contact Recology at (650) 595-3900 to get started today!

BULKY ITEM COLLECTION

Residential customers receive two curbside Bulky Item Collection (BIC) appointments per calendar year at no additional charge (available Monday – Friday, on your regular collection day) from **February 1 through December 31**.

CART SET-OUT GUIDELINES

- Set carts out by 6 a.m. on your collection day.
- **Place carts curbside** with wheels against the curb or roadside, with arrows on cart lids pointed toward the street.
- Leave two feet of space between each cart.
- Make sure lids are fully closed.
- **Put carts away once serviced** and/or within 24 hours to avoid a possible fine per Municipal Code requirements of your community.



Collection services do not occur on Christmas Day and New Year's Day. If your regular collection day falls on or after one of these holidays, your collection day will be provided on an alternate day. Customers affected by these two holidays will be notified in advance. **There are no service disruptions on any other holiday.**

COMMUNITY EVENTS

Free Shred (Document Destruction) **and E-Scrap** (i.e., Computers, TVs, and other Electronics) **Recycling Events** are available at participating Member Agencies each year. Visit **RethinkWaste.org/CommunityEvents** for a list of events.

SAN MATEO COUNTY OFFERS FREE HAZARDOUS WASTE PROGRAMS

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) such as cleaners, pesticides, and propane tanks cannot be disposed of in any of your three carts. San Mateo County's HHW Program helps residents responsibly dispose their HHW for free. **Residents must schedule an appointment at SMCHealth.org/HHW or by calling (650) 363-4718.**
