Spring is prime garage sale season, and what better time to hold one than during Earth Month?

Celebrate by holding a sale, possibly with your neighbors! Here are some tips for how to make yours a big success.

- Large signage: Use the largest piece of paper or cardboard and the biggest marker you can find. Be sure to include the date and address.
- Social media: List things for sale on Facebook Marketplace and Craigslist!
- 3. **Pricing:** Use a price sheet for similar items rather than trying to put tags on everything.
- 4. Pro: Putting your smaller items up on tables will allow those passing by to see them better. Hang clothing from hangers rather than laying it out on the ground.



5. Donate leftover items: Pack up things that didn't sell, and bring them to a local thrift store. Don't forget your tax receipt!
