RECYCLE

STATE LAW AB 341: MANDATORY COMMERCIAL RECYCLING

Requires businesses that generate 4 or more cubic yards of garbage each week and multifamily communities of 5 or more units to have recycling service for cardboard, paper, plastics, glass, and cans.

Place items loose in your recycle container. **Do not bag recyclables.**

STATE LAW SB 1383: MANDATORY ORGANICS COLLECTION
